## SUBJECT: 2024/25 DRAFT ANNUAL SERVICE PLAN

#### PURPOSE

The 2024/25 Draft Annual Service Plan is submitted to the Victoria Regional Transit Commission (the "Commission") for **APPROVAL**.

#### BACKGROUND

Each year, BC Transit develops an Annual Service Plan for the Victoria Regional Transit System (VRTS) to provide the Commission with a proposal for service improvements over the subsequent fiscal year.

In September 2023, in the Annual Service Expansion Request Letter, the Commission endorsed 20,000 annual service hours<sup>1</sup> and 8 buses for service expansion for the 2024/25 fiscal year<sup>2</sup>. Based on BC Transit's annual Transit Evaluation Process (TEPs)<sup>3</sup>, this Letter also recommended the following key strategic investment priorities over the next three years:

- RapidBus and Frequent Transit Network service improvements
- Development of the crosstown network on the Hillside/Gorge and Admirals/McKenzie corridors
- Simplifying and improving transit service on the Quadra corridor
- Improvements to YYJ Airport and Peninsula service

However, since the end of the declared COVID-19 Pandemic, ridership and traffic congestion have been returning rapidly, with the VRTS experiencing an almost 40 per cent increase in ridership over the last two years. Both operational data and Voice of the Rider survey feedback show a growing trend of more crowded buses, more pass-ups, and fewer buses arriving on time.

Therefore, to achieve the Victoria Regional Transit System's 10 Year Vision targets for comfortable and reliable service delivery, BC Transit is recommending that the majority of potential expansion resources in the 2024/25 fiscal year be used to reduce passenger crowding and improve schedule reliability. A small portion of service investment would remain available to achieve the highest ranked strategic and operational priority within the system in 2025: launching the McKenzie RapidBus Line. The remaining three strategic investment priorities

outlined above will be deferred to subsequent years, with the aim to implement them as soon as possible.
