Davey, GM of Victoria HandyDART service, provided a report</li> <li>Transition to the new operating company, TRANS DEV, has been going well; new company understands custom transit and are being thoughtful with transition</li> <li>Victoria is the busiest handyDART city in BC and is the most successful in pandemic recovery with respect to prepandemic service levels</li> <li>Recently received a new bus with electric assist to help passengers up the ramp; this feature will be included in all new buses</li> <li>Chair thanked W. Davey for report and asked if any Committee members had any questions         <ul> <li>S. Jennings asked how the hiring of new drivers was progressing as 3 Committee members tried to book service for today but service was booked</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	For Info	W. - W. Davey replied: 3 new drivers were on the road last month and 2 trainees have recently started; important to get the right type of person for the role
  - Is taking longer to be able to schedule Class 4 ICBC road tests which delays hiring
  - Confirmed handyDART is very motivated to get more drivers and meet service demand
- K. Highsted advised W. Davey that they had not contacted handyDART staff yet to discuss the challenges with the website
  - W. Davey replied: Website is being used more and more to book and cancel trips;
     Victoria only city in BC to have this on-line

- Customer surveys
  - BC Transit contracts a company to do annual survey and would like to know if Committee Members would like to contacted about the survey or if they had any ideas about questions that should be asked
    - Committee Members advised that they would like to be contacted

- Accessible transit presentations
  - In person presentations to community agencies have been initiated; a recent presentation was conducted at the Shoal Centre in Sidney
  - Organizations can contact S. Stevens to schedule a presentation
  - When possible, buses are brought to the location
  - These presentations are in addition to and separate from the Travel Training program that is now being conducted by CBI
    - This program is a 1:1opportunity for people with accessible challenges to learn how to use the conventional system
- BC Transit Website Review
  - It has been noted that handyDART info is difficult to find on the current BC Transit/VRTS website, so how to improve this access is being reviewed
    - K. Highsted suggested linking the on-line booking system to the website
    - S. Stevens reported that with the new custom registration process, there is no longer the requirement for documentation from a Dr.
